






## CONTAMINATED SOIL LANDFILL DEFERRAL ORDER

### Definitions

1 In this order:

“**Act**” means the *Environmental Management Act*;

“**contaminated soil**” means soil in which the concentration of a substance is greater than or equal to the lowest applicable industrial land use standard;

“**deferral period**” means the period of time beginning on the date this order comes into force and ending on July 15, 2020;

“**director**” has the same meaning as in the Act;

“**industrial land use standard**” means a standard referred to in section 41 (1) (a) of the Contaminated Sites Regulation, B.C. Reg. 375/96.

### Permits, approvals and operational certificates

2 A director must not, during the deferral period, issue or amend a permit, approval or operational certificate under section 14, 15, 16 or 28 of the Act so as to

- (a) authorize the introduction of contaminated soil into a landfill, or
- (b) increase the volume of contaminated soil that is authorized to be introduced into a landfill.
